Rise Testing: Our Rise testing season is upon us, beginning next week and continuing through mid-May. This is an excellent opportunity for our 3rd -6th grade students to demonstrate all the knowledge they've gained throughout the year. We are eager to see



our students shine and showcase their hard work. Acadience testing starts in 2 weeks, and is administered in grades K-6.

Remember, our goal is to improve our school scores while fostering a supportive and stress-free environment. We're confident in our students' abilities and encourage each student to try their very best during these tests.

Testing Tips

We understand that testing can sometimes be overwhelming, so we encourage our students to approach the tests with a positive mindset. Here are a few tips to support your child during this time:



- 1. **Good Night's Sleep:** Ensure your child gets a good night's sleep before each testing day. Rest is crucial for optimal performance.
- 2. **Healthy Breakfast:** A nutritious breakfast will help fuel your child's brain and body for the day ahead. As a reinder, we serve breakfast daily from 8:25-8:50.
- 3. **Arrive on Time:** Make sure your child arrives at school on time to avoid any unnecessary stress.
- 4. **Positive Attitude:** Encourage a positive attitude. Remind your child that these tests are simply a way to show how much they've learned. Children often pick up cues from the adults in their lives, so please be as positive about testing as you can be!


Fun Family Night and 2 for 1 Book Fair


