Our policy now includes clearer consequences for minor acts of misbehavior, as well as for more serious violation like acts of violence and the use of racial slurs. In line with our commitment to creating a safe learning environment, we are focusing on teaching students about bullying behavior. These educational sessions are conducted one grade at a time, and aim to help students identify bullying behavior in themselves and others. Our goal is to equip our students with the knowledge and tools they need to stand up against bullying, and to foster an atmosphere of kindness and respect.
